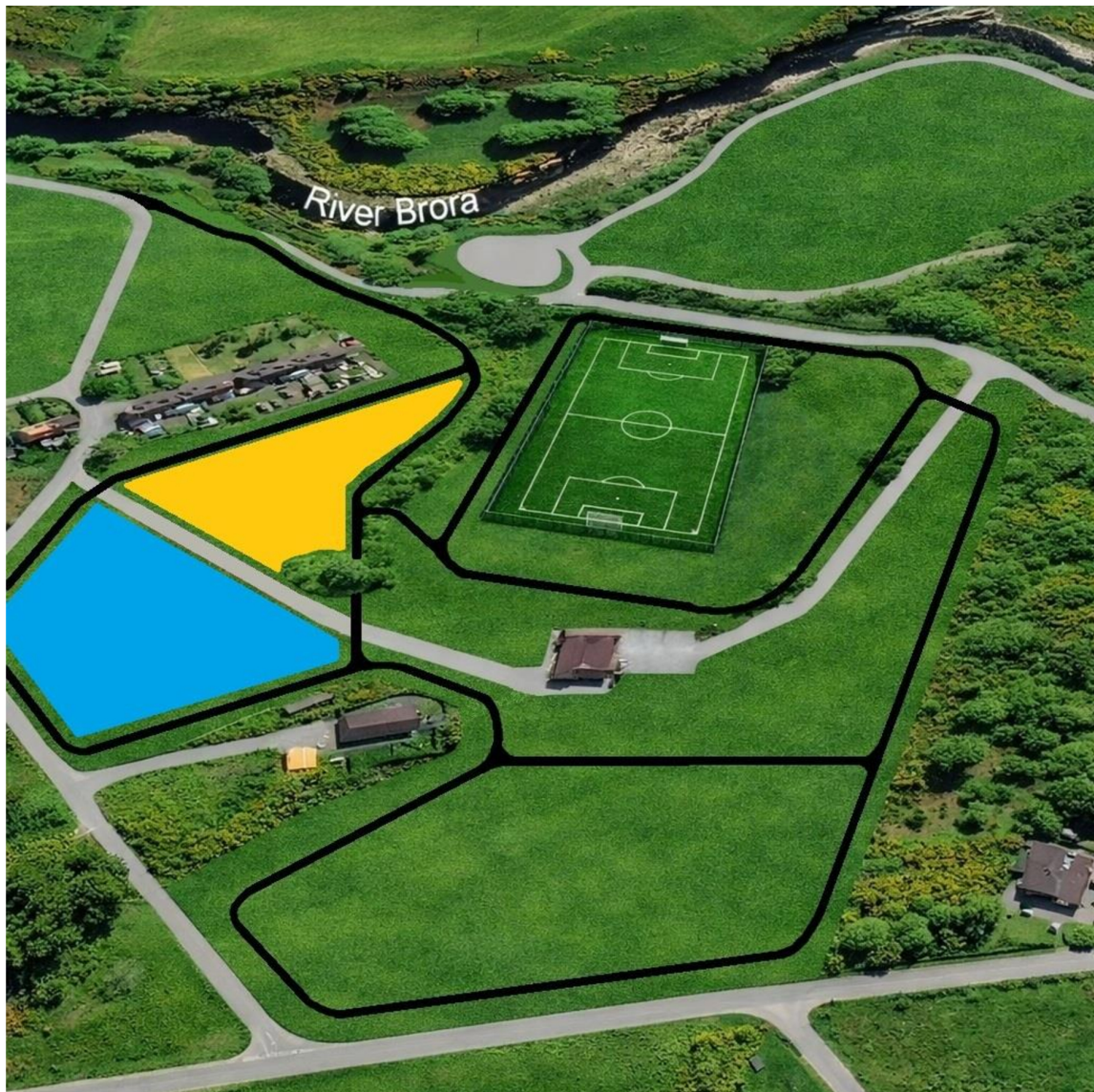


COMPLEX PATHS - ALL ACCESSIBLE AND INCLUSIVE

The most important project within the Clyne Community Complex is to make all areas accessible and inclusive. We want to make sure people with disabilities can enjoy the entire complex.

Below is the site path plan and it will utilize the entire area. The play park and outdoor fitness zone shown in yellow and blue will be a pedestrian only zone. The current road will be accessible via a gate either side and it will also separate the two zones. This will limit vehicles on site and further enhance the safe zone.



The circuit can be used by the community and visitors for running, walking and cycling all year round.

Below shows all accessible path passing the eco friendly games hall. With solar panel lighting this path can be used 24 hours a day every day of the year. It can be used for running, walking and cycling.



Having this path throughout the complex makes it accessible and inclusive for all. It will be a safe zone for people with disabilities. It can be used by locals, people throughout the north of Scotland and visitors.



The complex can have designated times or days for people who have disabilities. This will ensure people with disabilities feel comfortable in an environment that is safe with less traffic. It will encourage people to meet up and spend more time outdoors.



The complex will encourage families to be outdoors and be able to walk in an environment away from traffic.



The inside of all paths on the hill will have a wooden safety barrier.



Having an all-accessible path will be an ideal location for people learning how to cycle. The complex can be used by the Primary School for Cycling proficiency. This would help children who are anxious around traffic.



The path will follow the bottom level tier around the back end of the football park. The concrete slab area will be a viewpoint on match days and serve as a picnic area with benches throughout the year. It will allow people using wheelchairs and mobility scooters to get close to the action. The inside of the path will also have a safety barrier as shown elsewhere.



Like elsewhere this wooden safety barrier shown below will protect people using wheelchairs and mobility scooters. This will be key to ensuring the complex is inclusive to all and again provide safety throughout.
